Duplicate label is defined by the Board of Pharmacy in conjunction with DOPL to mean the following: A label or information that is dispensed on the final product or container ultimately given to the patient which contains the sample labeling information (active ingredients, beyond-use-date, storage conditions and lot number). This proof of this labeling information must be kept by the pharmacy and must be trackable, traceable, or reproducible and unalterable or contains an audit trail at the time of inspections or need of being retrievable. The duplicate label may also be provided in an electronic version that contains an audit trail.


